

Scheduling and Payments: To enroll, all riders must have current paperwork on file dated within one year. Riders will be invoiced via e-mail in advance so we will need a valid e-mail address for the responsible party. We divide the year into six riding sessions of 8 weeks. Payments for the entire session may be made conveniently and securely on line at www.rideon.org/session-payment.html. Payments by check or credit card can be made by mail or in the office. Payments are due prior to the start of each session. Riders may be denied a riding time if they have an outstanding unpaid balance from prior sessions. If you are not continuing to ride, please let us know as soon as possible.

Fees: Rate for our 8-week session is \$408.

Missed Lessons: Ride On is serving over 200 riders and patients each week and cancellations really hurt – we have staff, volunteers and horses ready and nobody to mount. More than likely we have turned away another rider to make room for you. Please help us respect the time our volunteers and staff and other riders! We do understand that unexpected medical conditions can affect our riders and, if that is the case, we will discuss tuition adjustments on an individual basis. If Ride On cancels a lesson, we will notify you by phone as soon as we can and credit your account. **If you do not show up for your lesson and you do not call, you will be charged.**

Make-up Lessons: our schedule is quite full so a rider may schedule only one (1) make-up lesson for a missed class per 8-week session. To qualify, you must give at least 1 day advance notice that you are cancelling and we will re-schedule you if the Ride On schedule permits. The rider is responsible for making an appointment with the instructor if he or she wishes to receive the make-up class.

Scholarships: Due to continued fundraising challenges, scholarships are very limited. Please contact our office for a scholarship application and we will try to help. Recipients are required to volunteer a minimum of ten (10) hours to help Ride On in some capacity.

Barn Management: Learning to groom, saddle and care for a horse is referred to as “barn management”. We believe that this hands-on experience with the horse is as important as riding. It is part of our program during inclement weather – rain or muddy conditions, for example. If a rider chooses not to attend barn management, they will not receive credit for the absence.
