

## Annual Report 2022 - Delivering Generations of Service

About Us: Ride On specializes in adaptive horseback riding. We teach riding skills to children and adults with intellectual and physical disabilities and we provide physical and occupational therapy using the movement of the horse to improve specific medical conditions. Our staff includes 7 certified instructors, 7 therapists and over 50 horses. Ride On has now given over 138,900 lessons in our 28-year history - improving the quality of life in our community one ride at a time.

<u>Service</u>: In 2022, Ride On gave over 8,900 lessons and treatments to an average of 200 clients on a weekly basis from three facilities up 29% over 2021. 246 volunteers donated just under 8,000 hours of work, down 42% from pre-Covid levels. 75% of our riders were children under age 18; 50% are physically and 50% are mentally disabled. We serve many types of disabilities with autism being the most frequent. Many riders have multiple disabilities requiring extensive staff and volunteer support.

<u>Unique Capacity:</u> Ride On has been nationally accredited since 1994 and remains the only

accredited provider of Hippotherapy in all of Los Angeles or Ventura County. Ride On provided over 1,200 physical, occupational and speech therapy treatments.


<u>Scholarships:</u> Ride On subsidizes the cost of lessons for all participants. Beyond that, we gave scholarships ranging from free lessons to  $\frac{1}{2}$  price for over 1,300 lessons or treatments to 45 families, about 21% of all lessons.

**Partnerships:** Ride On completed 21 years partnering with the Conejo Recreation and Park District which donates the lease of two ranches in Thousand Oaks comprising 33 acres. Walnut Grove, our home for 21 years, is the center for our adaptive riding program. Rancho Potrero Community Equestrian Center is our newest facility and is the heart of a growing equestrian education center for all abilities. Other partnerships include Horses in the Hood, Safe Passage Youth Foundation, Turner Syndrome Foundation, Tarzana Treatment Center, and CRPD Therapeutics to provide riding lessons for "at risk" youth, teens struggling with substance abuse and summer programs for campers with disabilities.

<u>Play LA:</u> Ride On has also partnered with the City of Los Angeles' Play LA Adaptive Program to provide para-equestrian programming to disabled and at-risk populations leading up to the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic games.

<u>Leadership:</u> Ride On continues to lead in the nonprofit sector in service delivery and education. We organized and hosted a free Networking and Education Day for 80 industry professionals, teach PATH Registered Instructor Workshops and manage and host the CALNET Show and US Equestrian Federation para equestrian clinics.

<u>Accountable:</u> Ride On sees itself as a public trust and we have always been a leader in transparency to the public. For years we have posted our audited financial statements and IRS tax forms on our website at <a href="www.RideOn.org">www.RideOn.org</a>.
